USCGC Blackthorn Remembered at January 28 Memorial Service

Coast Guardsmen lost in the sinking of the cutter *Blackthorn* were remembered in a memorial service on January 28th. It was the 33rd anniversary of that tragic event and the Sarasota - Manatee Council presented a wreath as part of the solemn remembrance.

The *Blackthorn* sank near the Sunshine Skyway on the evening of

January 28, 1980, after colliding with the tanker Capricorn. Of the 50 Coast Guardsmen aboard, 23 were lost. One of those, Seaman Apprentice William Flores was posthumously awarded the Coast Guard Medal, the service's highest award for heroism in peacetime: As the ship capsized, SA Flores used his belt to hold open the door of a life jacket locker; his


actions helped save several of his shipmates but cost him his life.

The memorial to those lost on the Blackthorn is in a park on the Sunshine Skyway causeway north of the main span and is a fitting tribute. Plan to pay a quiet visit, and be reminded of the sacrifices sometimes made for us by "...those in peril on the sea."

maintenance on the Station 45 RB-M. MK3 Danahey's Coast Guard mechanical knowledge coupled with his past experience with jet driven propulsion system made him a vital assist in this kind of Depot level maintenance, not normally conducted at the station level. He is an

Prior to attending the Sergeants Major Academy, Master Chief Wong was assigned to Recruit Training Center Cape May. He completed his tour at Cape May as the Battalion Commander. As the senior enlisted member in the Recruit Training Battalion, Master Chief Wong directly supervised 63 Company Commanders, and managed the day-to-day operations of recruit training. His other assignments include ISC Honolulu, HI; CGC Point Evans, HI; ISC Portsmouth, VA; CGC Vigilant, FL; and Training Center Cape May Health Services Center, NJ.

Master Chief Wong's military training include the USCG Chief Petty Oficer Academy Class 124, USCG Senior Enlisted Leadership Course, USCG Company

Commander School, USCG Instructor Development Course, US Navy Independent Duty Corpsman School, US Army (91-C) Nursing Program, USCG Health Services "A" School, and Emergency Medical Technician School.

Master Chief Wong holds both a Masters and Bachelor of Science Degree in Health Care Management from Touro University International. In addition, he is currently pursuing a second Masters of Arts Degree in Education and Organizational Management from North Central University.

Barbara's love for the military and desire to continue the legacy was inspired by her mother, Dorothy.

On Nov. 23, 1942, President Franklin Roosevelt signed Public Law 772 of the 77th Congress, 2nd Session, creating the Women's Reserve of the Coast Guard. Navy LT Dorothy Stratton, former dean of women at Purdue University, agreed to transfer to the Coast Guard and, with the rank of Lieutenant Commander, became director of the Coast Guard Women's Reserve. An informal proposal to call the Coast Guard women WARCOGS was mercifully abandoned. Stratton suggested that the Women's Reserve be known by an acronym based on the Coast Guard motto: "Semper Paratus - Always Ready" SPARS.
