On February 20th, 2025 the Sarasota-Manatee Council-Navy League of the US hosted a successful dinner event at The Lake Club in Lakewood Ranch with over 75 guests. The featured speaker, Vice Admiral Johnny Wolfe Jr., USN, Director for Strategic Systems Programs and Director for Naval Nuclear Weapons Oversight Program spoke on the U.S. Navy's strategic plans, including the Columbia-class submarine program and strengthening military capabilities by 2027. Distinguished guests in attendance included VADM (Ret.) Doug Crowder, RADM (Ret.) Larry Chambers, RADM (Ret.) Rick Buchanan, and Senator Rick Scott's District Representative, Luis Laracuente. A special highlight of the evening was the presentation of the Navy League's highest recognition award, The Scroll of Honor, to Steve Bartek, VP of Youth Groups. VADM Wolfe and Council Secretary Jerry St Germain presented the award, along with a personal letter of recognition from Senator Rick Scott, in honor of Steve's outstanding leadership and dedication to over 1,000 students in the nine youth programs throughout Sarasota and Manatee Counties. Ow-Elroy kicked off the event with heartfelt opening remarks, thanking our members, partners, and guests, and introducing our guest speaker for the evening. USCG Chief Petty Officer (DCC) Tim Bakels, President of the Suncoast Chief Petty Officer Association, shared an inspiring update on the impact of our \$3,600 donation to U.S. Coast Guard families affected by Hurricanes Milton and Helene. It was a powerful reminder of the difference we're making in the lives of those who serve.



Recent SMC Events

On Tuesday January 28, hundreds of Coast Guard members, along with family, friends, and community leaders, gathered at North Skyway Fishing Pier to honor the 23 lives lost when the USCGC Blackthorn capsized on January 28, 1980. Board members of the Sarasota-Manatee Council —Jared Sweetser, Gerald St. Germain, and Steve Bartek—presented a wreath during the solemn ceremony, paying tribute to the victims of the tragedy. The event marked the 45th anniversary of the collision between the Blackthorn and the motor vessel Capricorn near the Sunshine Skyway Bridge, which resulted in the loss of 23 crew members out of 50 aboard. Retired Master Chief Petty Officer John L. Chassereau, president of the Blackthorn Memorial Committee, expressed the Coast Guard's enduring commitment to honoring those who made the ultimate sacrifice: "The Coast Guard is honored to continue to recognize all those who gave their lives 45 years ago during the tragic Cutter Blackthorn event." The ceremony featured a flyover by Coast Guard Air Station Clearwater, a wreath laying, and an honor platoon representing each Blackthorn victim, as well as the laying of roses. Rear Adm. Douglas M. Schofield, Coast Guard District Seven Commander, presided over the official remarks.





United States Coast Guard News

March 15th a US Coast Guard Station St Petersburg boat crew rescued four boaters after their 18-foot vessel sank near Bayboro Harbor. The U.S. Coast Guard crew retrieved all four people from the water & transferred two, to a Pinellas County Sheriff's Office boat crew to meet St. Petersburg Fire Rescue at St. Petersburg Municipal Marina. The vessel was salvaged.

This past Feb 21 weekend one of our St. Pete crews assisted the US Coast Guard with a sinking vessel in Tampa Bay. They were able to dewater the boat together and tow the vessel to a nearby boat ramp. We always enjoy getting to work with the brave men and women of the Coast Guard!
