# SMC Received a \$4000 Community Foundation of Sarasota County Grant to assist in Capacity Fund Raising Initiatives

The board now has an active outreach program to canvas local corporations, associations, businesses and individual partners for funding programs. With a funded program the SMC has purchased a professional Customer Relations Management (CRM) system for the engagement committee to conduct outreach programs using due diligence, identifying donor prospects with lead generations, and track all the engagements from beginning to fulfillment. The Engagement team began using this platform in September promoting our new Partnership Program outreach program and we have interested parties close to making commitments. In just the last two months the Engagement Committee Outreach initiatives have received <u>\$7000</u> through the new partnership program.

# Sarasota Events Calendar Interview with Council President Gene Moran Anchoring Our Past: Preserving Maritime Heritage for Future Generations

In honor of Veteran's Day, it feels appropriate to shine a spotlight on a nonprofit organization that many may not know about. The Navy League of Sarasota-Manatee is a vibrant organization dedicated to supporting the sea services, preserving maritime history, fostering patriotism through multi-effort community engagements. With a mission that emphasizes national security and maritime interests, this council also plays a crucial role in connecting local citizens with the U.S. Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and Merchant Marines.



Members of the Navy League of Sarasota-Manatee County include high ranking retired naval officers: Gene Moran, Navy, League President and a retired Navy Captain; Steve Bartek, Youth/Scholarships Director; Robert McChesney, Navy League Trustee and retired Navy Commander; Dick Petrucci, Retired Navy Captain, and Andy Morabe, Logistics Coordinator

The council — one of 180 councils of its kind — actively engages in various initiatives, including scholarship programs for local students. Each year, they award scholarships to outstanding seniors involved in Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) programs and children of sea service veterans. These scholarships not only support education but also encourage leadership and community involvement among youth in Sarasota and Manatee counties. In addition to educational outreach, the Navy League of Sarasota-Manatee is committed to recognizing local Navy League of Sarasota-Manatee is committed to recognizing local service members.

The Navy League of Sarasota-Manatee exemplifies how local organizations can make a significant impact. Their efforts have not gone unnoticed. They were recently won a Platinum Mackie Award in 2023 for their communications efforts. The Mackie Awards are given annually by the Navy League of the United States to recognize councils for excellence in communications. Additionally, the Sarasota-Manatee Council was named an "Outstanding" council in the 2023 Council Performance Awards. These awards recognize councils that "strived for excellence in multiple areas throughout the prior calendar year" based on their annual reports detailing council activities. Receiving both a Platinum Mackie Award and an Outstanding Council Performance Award in 2023 indicates that the Sarasota-Manatee Council was recognized as one of the top-performing Navy League councils nationally.

On Veterans Day, some of the member of the Navy League set up a tent near the annual Parade and offered hand-outs about their organization and speaking with the public about their work in Pinellas, Sarasota and Manatee counties, as well as the nine Sarasota County schools where they promote youth outreach, one of their primary goals. It is through the school's programs that 13-16 year old boys and girls "become inspired," says Gene Moran, President of the Navy League, Sarasota-Manatee and a retired US Navy Captain.

"Our ROTC units provide learning experiences such as flight academy in Pensacola, Florida (simulators), and we support \$1,700 to individuals for them to attend." Moran says the nonprofit historically raised funding they needed through golf tournaments, but now they have introduced "tiered sponsorships" to raise the funds they need to do their good will." We also support two active Coast Guard ships stationed in St. Petersburg," Moran adds. "We buy technology for them and perks such as barbecue grills and other amenities to make the sailors' live enhanced. "

Scholarship programs are an integral part of their mission. Locally, they have traditionally offered two, \$5,000 Academic scholarships and two (but last year, three) National Flight Academy (\$1.7k each) scholarships. In addition, they make cash donations to the units' operating funds. Last year that was about \$7,500. They also sponsor an Awards Luncheon in April where they recognize their best students and Scholarship awardees. Steve Bartek, a former US Navy Commander (now retired) oversees the Navy League's Youth programs and scholarships. He says "We worked with Venice High School MOROIC fund raising project, and we delivered them a check for \$12,000. And the VMS unit requested \$1,200 to help with their trip to Costa Rica which we granted. We have opportunities like this pop up ad hoc quite often."

Retired Navy Captain Dick Petrucci has been with the Navy League since 2002. "We are not a military organization per se, but a civilian group that wants to help since there is Sa lot of commonalities between us. Petrucci adds that they hope to attract a younger membership to raise awareness to the younger generation of how important it is to keep maritime history alive. "Freedom of the Seas is paramount to the safety of our seas and logistics for economies. We want to help people see that broader picture." Their dedication to promoting maritime heritage and supporting those who serve ensures that both current — and future generations understand the importance of our naval forces. #### USCG STATION ST PETERSBURG HURRICANE CLEANUP



In the wake of the recent hurricanes, our crew has come together with unwavering determination to tackle the challenges ahead. They have rolled up their sleeves to clear the wreckage and assess the damage to our station, pouring their time and effort into every detail of the restoration. Together, we are committed to not just restoring our station, but also reinforcing the spirit that defines us. It's a testament to their resilience and dedication to the mission, showing that we can overcome any obstacle when we stand united. Their quick action and hard work ensure the success of our life-saving mission and enable us to provide critical support to the community in this time of need.

U.S. Coast Guard Station Cortez and US Coast Guard Station St Petersburg crews helped two men, Dec 18th, after their boat's battery died, 15 miles off Egmont Key. The men activated a personal locator beacon and sent a satellite text to a friend notifying the #USCG of their location and type of distress. They were brought ashore





It is with great pride that we congratulate MK2 Blanchard on being named U.S. Coast Guard Sector St Petersburg Sailor of the Year—an honor that he has earned through his performance and dedication. Throughout the year, his exceptional work ethic and accomplishments have made a lasting impact. Notably, MK2 Blanchard spearheaded a \$4,000 project to renovate the station's engineering and deck department floors, significantly enhancing the safety and professionalism of our work environment. He also provided invaluable engineering support to the Coast Guard Cutter Sea Devil during its month-long voyage from Washington State to Kings Bay, Georgia, ensuring the crew's safe and efficient transit. In addition, during both hurricanes this year, his quick action and unwavering readiness to relocate the 45' RBM allowed the station to quickly resume operations. MK2 Blanchard has also played a vital role in countless search-and-rescue missions, saving many lives in the process. Through his dedication and outstanding contributions, he has brought immense credit to both the Coast Guard and Station St. Petersburg. Bravo Zulu, shipmate!



SMC Adopted ship Coast Guard Cutter Resolute crew returned home in October, offloads approximately \$115 million worth of drugs in St. Petersburg. Resolute's crew deployed to the Caribbean Sea for 38 days in support of Joint Interagency Task Force-South (JIATF-South), an interagency and international task force that conducts counter-illicit trafficking and security cooperation operations in the Caribbean Sea and the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. During their patrol, the Resolute crew was strategically positioned to deny drug trafficking organizations access to maritime smuggling routes from Central and South America to prevent harmful narcotics from reaching the United States. Resolute is a 210foot, Reliance-class medium endurance cutter home ported in St. Petersburg. The cutter's primary missions are counter drug operations, migrant interdiction, enforcement of federal fishery laws, and search and rescue in support of U.S. Coast Guard operations throughout the Western Hemisphere. Bravo Zulu Resolute!!!!! Welcome Home.





Recently <u>US Coast Guard Station St Petersburg's</u> boat crew responded to an urgent report of a man in distress aboard a disabled vessel. Upon arrival, the crew assessed the individual, who was in and out of consciousness and displaying symptoms consistent with a suspected heart attack, raising concerns. The situation was critical, and <u>U.S. Coast Guard Air Station Clearwater</u> arrived swiftly alongside station Saint Petersburg to provide assistance. Our crew members executed a successful hoist operation, safely transferring the patient onto the helicopter to ensure he received the immediate medical care he required.
