#### **Dear Fellow Board Members:**

As of February 10, 2024 the Sarasota-Manatee Council of the Navy League of the United States (NLUS) has approximately 113 active members per the official roster posted on the NLUS national website.

The Navy League "launched" a new website and membership database at the beginning of the year that should incorporate several security measures to protect members' personal data. We have had to designate 2 members who would have access to our Council members' information and have designated Gene Moran and me as our reps. (Jerry is in the process of getting access via his role in Regional Leadership for the Navy League.).

Unfortunately, there have been "growing pains" with the launch of the new website and we are in close contact with the national NLUS staff as we resolve access issues to our membership data.
