## Meeting minutes 1/13/2025

## **ZOOM Meeting**

The session began with the approval of the December minutes, which were moved by Cindy Dickson and seconded by Marsha Grogan, receiving unanimous support. The focus then shifted to the voting of a slate of directors, including Lorna Ow-Elroy as 1<sup>st</sup> VP, Steve Bartek VP for Youth Programs, VADM Crowder, Cindy Dickson, Marsha Grogan, Bo Hamrick, Joe Hayden, Andhy Morabe, Don Roser and Robert McChesney. Jared Sweetser motioned for the approval of the slate, which was seconded and subsequently approved by all present officers.

Jared provided an overview of the budget, setting a fundraising target of \$32,000 to support scholarships and active duty Coast Guard units. Concerns were raised by Gene Moran and Robert McChesney regarding the absence of match funding from the previous year, which impacted financial goals. The discussion included the shipmate partnership initiative as a potential solution to address funding gaps.

Jared reported a cash on hand of approximately \$29,000, highlighting the organization's current financial status. The necessity of cultivating partnerships for stable funding, especially during summer months, was emphasized, alongside discussions about reduced funding for youth programs and the need for clarity in scholarship obligations.

The board deliberated on scholarship fund allocation, with Cindy advocating for prioritizing military-associated candidates. Gene stressed the importance of finalizing the budget to ensure timely communication with schools about scholarship offerings. After discussions, the board agreed to allocate \$5,000 for scholarships, with plans to revisit the distribution process later. Joseph Hayden moved to approve the budget, which was approved with one abstention.

Marsha Grogan reported on the ongoing repairs at the station, noting the lack of flooring and the challenges in selecting contractors. Gene Moran shared that the council was spotlighted on LinkedIn for their hurricane relief efforts, with Robert McChesney elaborating on the recognition and its significance for the council's community impact.

Cindy Dickson discussed strategies to engage 44 members with expiring memberships, proposing events such as a cocktail party and suggesting that members participate in one volunteer activity and one social event each year. Gene Moran acknowledged the plan's viability and noted previous outreach efforts to lapsed members. Jerry St. Germain provided an update on the membership roster, highlighting those whose memberships have lapsed.

Gene provided an update on old business, highlighting the new shipmate level of partnership that facilitates smaller monthly contributions. Robert added that they are actively working on multiple fronts to enhance community engagement and visibility. He expressed confidence in their ability to meet and exceed their goals for 2025.

Jay Plager discussed the Navy League manual, highlighting its complexity and the need for updated bylaws for their organization. Gene Moran described the current bylaws as an outdated document that is treated with undue reverence. Jay asked Gene to resend an email with pertinent information, while Robert McChesney offered to assist in locating articles of incorporation.

Robert McChesney suggested a membership survey to assess how to improve relationships and offerings, aiming for about 15 questions. Joseph Hayden emphasized the need for feedback, while Marsha Grogan highlighted the importance of cross-training team members for event planning. They also discussed the potential for combining the Sea Service Heroes event with a Navy event, considering logistical challenges and timing.

The meeting concluded with discussions on bylaws, the importance of community presence, and the need for a membership survey to enhance engagement, alongside planning for upcoming events and potential collaborations.

#### **USCG Hurricane Damage**

P1 CS3 (RESOLUTE): took on 4 feet of water in the house during Hurricane Helene, lost pretty much everything, including inventory from her previous business, car, and then was burglarized while on leave. Had estimate of \$30k of contents within home lost/stolen.

P1 Two MK3s (VENTUROUS): both MK3s lived together, the roof and a wall were ripped off during Hurricane MILTON, causing a great deal of their personal items to be damaged. Immediately following the storm, while we were waiting to return to port, their destroyed apartment was looted, and many valuable items were stolen from them.

P1 SN (VENTUROUS): reported to VENTUROUS the day before we sortied to avoid Hurricane MILTON, bringing wife and child in an RV camper. They set up the camper in a mobile home park and wife and child evacuated to a family member's house in Tennessee, while mbr got underway. MILTON destroyed their RV camper and left them without a home until they could find something suitable, with a non-rate income.

P1 AET1 (AIRSTA): moving between couches and hotels with his two children (single father). Once D7 stops the emergency funding, he will be left paying for a mortgage and rent out of his own pocket.

P2 AET1 (AIRSTA): living with family right now with his dependents

P2 SN (RESOLUTE): upon reporting to St. Pete from boot camp, left his personal vehicle on the pier with all personal belongings and flew out to meet CGC RESOLUTE on patrol. During Helene, vehicle and all personal belongings were destroyed by storm surge. Still working through insurance claim to get a new car but lost everything he was planning on using in his new residence.

P2 EO (RESOLUTE): house flooded by 4 feet of storm surge during Hurricane Helene, requiring complete renovation, re-wiring, etc. The house is still not livable and EO is doing all the renovation work on his free time.

P2 MK2 (STA CORTEZ): home sustained significant damage and mbr has an extremely high insurance deductible.
